It will take about an hour of your time. We have a couple gifts for you and a pamphlet of information.

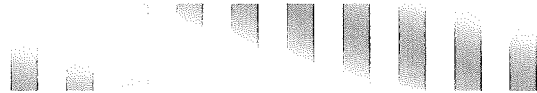

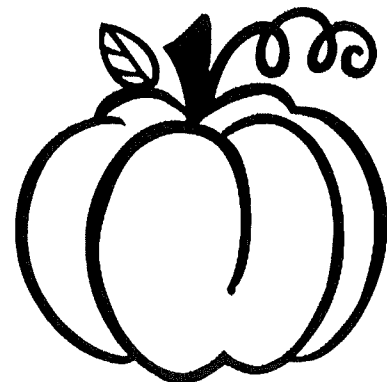

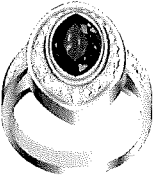
Starting in September 2023, we will be switching to yearly color coded Reservation sheets for the use of the Clubhouse.

Board of Directors
Informational Meeting
Friday September 8, 2023
1:00 PM

Present: Mike Kahn, Jeanette DeLisi, Steve Gade, Anita Love, Mike Longyear and Don Morris. Absent: Ruth Freer.
President Mike Kahn welcomed everyone watching on Facebook.

Mike Kahn-WWTP-irrigation pond had a break, water and sand went under the liner. Has been corrected but had no water for irrigation. We got an estimate from Environ Waste to clean the sewer pipes, around \$130,000. The ponds are not perking because they are full of sludge. Talked to our engineer and he suggested to put an emergency pond on the land out front. After a rain there is 5-10 thousand extra gallons of water running through the plant. A resident wants to purchase a tall van and wants to have approval to raise his carport roof to accommodate the van. All present agreed. Request a letter in writing to state it is only a passenger van, not a camper. Speeding is certainly a problem in here. We are putting in some stencils on the roads to slow down, speed limit and crosswalks. Had 3 meters at the plant hit by lightning and are waiting for delivery to be installed, hopefully will get some reimbursement from insurance. Spoke to our pool consult and asked about cooling the water off in the pool. Said there is a unit (heat pump reverse) he will look into pricing. Do not flush diapers, towels, pills etc. down the toilet. This causes backups and is very costly. Pills can be dropped off at local police departments.

Anita Love-Looked around the clubhouse and found some needed repairs and special cleaning. Cleaned the exercise room. Door by the porch is rusted through. Will be getting the bocce ball courts ready for play. Need to do some fundraisers to help with costs of some of these projects. There is a bench in the exercise room that is not used anymore, want to get rid of it. Trouble with getting insurance on our homes. Will not insure with grey pipe. Have estimates to replace 4-5 thousand. Wellness check meeting in October.

Mike Longyear-Quotes on pipe repair at 120 Victoria. Clubhouse roof quotes-will review. Any complaints on the gardens, see me.

Jeanette DeLisi-Had a resident turn in over a 160 complaints, verified them and sent notices. The new branch of service Space Force will be added to Veterans Day program. Still working on the lights at the shuffleboard courts. Jan Swayze resigned as Election Judge. BOD will decide on replacement. Question on new facebook page re:golf course. Bill Lantz will answer later. Suggestion box-hole on Straphmore ML-have bids for repair – kitchen open full time- J-tried before & didn't work. Working on opening kitchen Wednesday and Fridays for lunch and one dinner a month, to start in October. We need a list of who has keys to the kitchen. Social Club-9/16 Poker Run, and 9/20 Welcome Back Dance & 9/27 Pasta Night \$8. Carport sale will be November 4th as the 11th is Veterans Day. Rule violations cannot respond to verbal complaints. Enforce only written complaints and they are verified prior to a notice going out. The residents at 159 Townbridge are having medical problems and need to rehome a 7 year old male Shitz Shu, if interested see me after the meeting.

Don Morris-If you have an old flag, I will take to the American Legion to properly dispose of.

Steve Gade-The greens are coming back. Unable to get proper sod on #5-will be adding plugs for now. Have done aerating and spraying.

Comments:

Wil MacDonald-Grass is overgrown on the brick legacy walk.

Bruce Julin-Never had problems cooling pool down before, part has been repaired on the solar system. Do we still have the seals purchased for the manholes, do you think that would solve the problem? MK-they will be put on after the cleaning and repairs. The pump on #3 has been down for quite awhile. MK-waiting on electrician to rewire and put the pump on a chunk of cement to help prevent all the debris from clogging it again.

Perry Harkness-Requested to start a couple of new golf events. There is confusion on the motion and approval. MK-we voted to not allow the new leagues and hand it off to the golf board for consideration.

Betsy Dykeman-My personal opinion don't waste money on the stencils. Everyone knows they just don't care.

Linda Kahn-Ladies lunch at Olive Garden on 9/20. I think the stencils will work. Trying to get a stop light at the Government center, have contacted FDOT.

Karen Roy-Concern a lot of different contractors trucks have damaged yards. MK-if you know the name of the company call them to report, if unknown, it is the homeowners responsibility to repair. Grass companies taking advantage of snowbirds and not doing their lawns. Some have too many customers.

Robert Zwack-If we have the retention pond fixed we won't need to do a temporary pond out front. MK-maybe, but we have to address the issue of water infiltration at the plant.

Mike Flemming-Clarify confusion about working on the Butterfly Gardens. J-you sure can. Can we get some new chairs at the pickle ball courts? MK-will look into that.

Anita Love-I want to point out that when some residents leave, they don't fill out the form for the office. If you can read, then read the stop sign. Golfers you don't have to go that fast, the holes aren't going anywhere. Thanks to the volunteers that helped clean the pool furniture.

Bill Lantz-The golf course website is Sweetwater golf and maintenance Facebook page. It is for communication only, not for complaints.

Jeanette DeLisi made a motion to waive the reading of the minutes from the August 3, 2023 Board of Directors meeting and to approve them as posted. The motion was seconded by Don Morris and the motion passed.

Steve Gade moved to accept the Treasurers report as presented (as posted on bulletin board in the Clubhouse) seconded by Mike Longyear and passed unanimously.

Old Business:

New Business:

- Motion by Mike Longyear to hire SCC Concrete at a cost not to exceed \$6500.00 to repair thirteen pot holes and the large crack on the boulevard. Seconded by Jeanette DeLisi and passed unanimously.
- Motion by Mike Longyear to hire SCC Concrete at a cost not to exceed \$6000.00 to repair the pipe at 120 Victoria Drive. Ten feet at the street and ten feet at the canal. Seconded by Don Morris and passed unanimously.
- Motion by Mike Kahn to hire Environ Waste Services of Orlando to clean, scope and repair breaks in our underground waste pipes to help eliminate water infiltration to our WWTP, not to exceed \$135,000.00. Seconded by Anita Love. Discussion followed and vote was tabled.

Announcements:

There being no other business before the Board Jeanette DeLisi made a motion to adjourn and it was seconded by Mike Longyear. The motion carried and the meeting adjourned at 3:20 PM.

REMINDERS FROM THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS
FROM THE RULES & REGULATIONS BOOKLET
SOME RULES HAVE BEEN TRUNCATED FOR SPACE

All outdoor decorations and lights, other than Christmas, may be displayed two (2) weeks before and one (1) week after the holiday. Christmas and Hanukkah outdoor decorations and lights may be displayed from Thanksgiving Day - January 6. See Section 3, L.

Exterior lamppost nameplates must have the surname (last name) of the owner clearly visible and legible, painted on both sides, in white letters (minimum of 1.5" high) on a black background. Section 3, K.

Each lot must be seeded or sodded. The owner/resident (full or part time) shall be responsible to keep home and lot neat and clean, grass cut and edged at all times. Section 3, E.

Residents are responsible for maintaining their property in good condition. Homes should be periodically washed to remove mildew and shall be kept clean and in good repair, to include (but not limited to) faded and chipped paint and siding. (Adopted 2/21/2023) The resident is responsible for the home, structural appurtenances and all items located on the lot, as well as mowing, weeding, edging, trimming and general care of the lawn, including fertilization and treatment for insect infestation. Residents leaving for a period of more than fourteen (14) days must notify the Corporation of their leaving and what arrangements they have made to care for their home and lot during their absence. Lots and homes which are not maintained to the standards of the community will be maintained by the Corporation at the prevailing commercial rate per occurrence that will be charged to the owner. (Approved 2-18-2020) The Corporation shall have the right, but not the obligation, to enter upon a lot for the purpose of maintaining the same. Residents are responsible for the maintenance of the landscaping. (Hedges shall not be allowed to grow in excess of four (4) feet in height. Trees and shrubbery must be cut back from the street line so as not to obstruct visibility for oncoming traffic. Section 3, A.

PLEASE WALK AROUND YOUR HOUSE TO SEE IF ANY OF THESE RULES AND REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN NEGLECTED AND MAKE THE APPROPRIATE CORRECTIONS.

PLEASE REMOVE CONTRACTORS' LAWN SIGNS AFTER THE WORK HAS BEEN COMPLETED.
