# **Board of Directors Meeting Minutes**

**@ Clubhouse, Friday December 16, 2022 3:00 PM**

This is a live broadcast on Facebook.

President Mike Kahn called the meeting to order at 3:00 PM. Acting Secretary Ruth Freer gave proof of due notice, roll call was taken, constituting a quorum.

Don Morris made a motion to waive the reading of the minutes from the October 21, 2022 Board of Directors meeting and to approve them as posted. The motion was seconded by Fred Mullin and the motion passed. Fred Mullin moved to accept the Treasurers report as presented (as posted on bulletin board in the Clubhouse) seconded by Ruth Freer and passed unanimously.

## **Old Business:**

Nancy read a letter addressing regarding comments/questions from the informational meeting. Non-shareholders are not allowed to speak at meetings. Three minute rule to speak. - Motion by Nancy Hasselmann to hire Zafircourt & Sons LLC to resurface the tennis courts at a cost of \$11,000 coming from reserves. Seconded by Don Morris and passed unanimously.
- Motion to hire Zafricourt & Sons LLC to resurface the shuffle board courts for a cost of \$9000, coming from reserves. Seconded by Ruth Freer and passed unanimously.
- Motion by Steve Gade to hire Walkers Fence Co. to replace gates at Newcastle, Edinburgh and Sewer main entrance (with using Newcastle for Edinburgh) for a cost of \$3682.02. Seconded by Fred Mullin and passed unanimously.

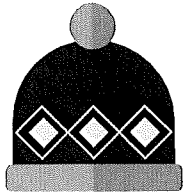


### Information from The Pro Shop

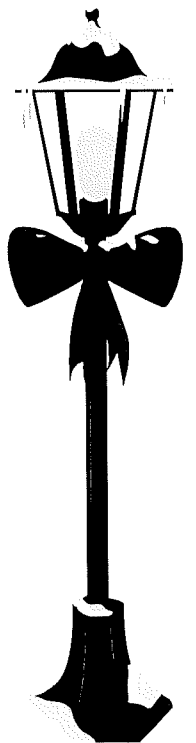

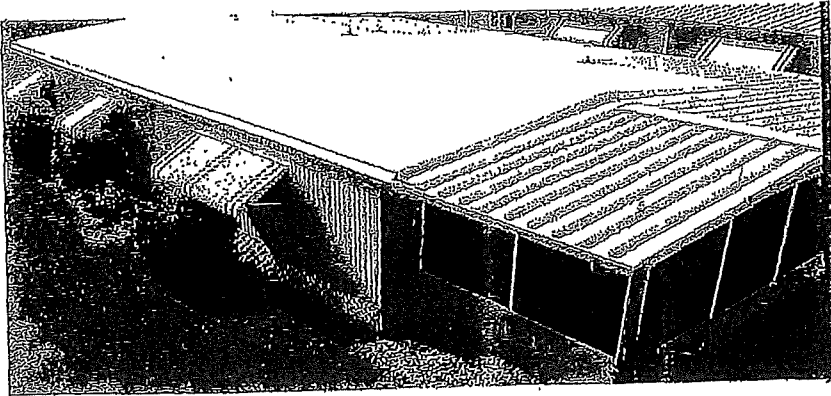

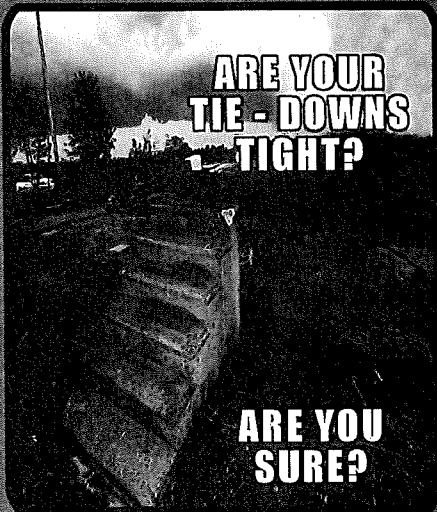
