MEET YOUR HOLIDAY TRADITION

For many, the Christmas season ends with ringing in the New Year. Gathering with friends; staying up past midnight; singing "Auld Lang Syne", are all part of this celebration. But when did the tradition of singing "Auld Lang Syne" on New Year's Eve begin? And what is the history behind this quaintly-phrased folksong?

"Auld Lang Syne" is credited to Scottish poet Robert Burns. He was known as the "ploughman (plowman) poet" because of his deep connection with Scottish rural life. He traveled throughout the country collecting traditional songs with folksy lyrics. Most experts think that "Auld Lang Syne" was created by Burns in 1788, using elements from a variety of traditional rural songs. "It is impossible to say how many stories and tunes 'Auld Lang Syne' is derived from," says Murray Pittock, a literary historian. Burns himself denied that "Auld Lang Syne" was his original creation. Rather, he said, "I took it down from an old man." And he set the lyric to the tune of a traditional Scottish folk song. The version commonly sung today, however, is not the tune Burns originally used.

The prevailing translation of this Scottish- gaelic title is "old long since". But it can also be interpreted as "long, long ago", "old time's sake", or "days gone by". Thus, "For auld lang syne", as it appears in the chorus, would be translated as, "for (the sake of) old times". The song begins by posing a question as to whether it is right that old times be forgotten, and is generally asking the singer to remember long-standing friendships.

So how did this ditty make it to the United States from Scotland? And how did the tune become associated with ringing/singing in the New Year? The song became popular in Scotland on Hogmanay or New Year's Eve and very quickly became a Scots custom that soon spread to other parts of the British Isles. As Scots, English, Welsh, and Irish people emigrated around the world, they took the song with them.

Also, the works of Robert Burns became very popular and collectible in New York high society in the 1880's through to the time of the Great Depression. There were dances and people gathering in Times Square to welcome in the New Year. These gatherings were attended by people like William Randolph Hearst and Henry Ford. They collected Burns's writings because they realized what a good investment they were and they admired Burns because he was seen as a self-made man. Then in 1929, Canadian bandleader, Guy Lombardo, used the song as a fill-in between two radio programs during a live performance at New York City's Roosevelt Hotel. Purely by coincidence, the band struck up this tune just after the stroke of midnight. Thus a New Year's Eve tradition was born. Lombardo became known as "Mr. New Year's Eve."

Even though the traditional use of "Auld Lang Syne" is to bid farewell to the old year at midnight, it is also sung at funerals, graduations, reunions, and at the International Boy Scout Youth Movement in many countries, to close their jamborees and other functions.

According to Christine Nelson, curator of the Burns exhibit at New York's Morgan Library and Museum, "The genius of Burns was that he recognized the power of this old song, and he revitalized it and preserved its essential Scottishness while capturing universal sentiments. He had a genius for touching every note of human emotion."

The full story of the most-performed song in the world after "Happy Birthday" may never be known, but one thing is certain, says Claire Prentice, columnist for the Washington Post: "If Burns were alive, the profits from "Auld Lang Syne" would have made him a billionaire many times over."

Here are copies of the song using both the original language of Burns and current language.

- Discussion on motions by the Board of Directors need to be discussed at workshop. Possibly meet one hour earlier.


Announcements:

Announcements:


- Steve Gade announced that for the November 8th election to use golf carts and there are handicap golf cart parking spots on the patio blocks.

The ladies golf league has been collecting for this Project for the last several years. 
